Accreditation







Students in religious schools enjoy a significant academic advantage over their counterparts in traditional public schools and charter schools, according to findings in a 2013 meta-analysis of 90 studies by William Jaynes (California State University professor / Witherspoon Institute senior fellow). Jaynes calls religious schools "the best hope for American education."
